

**REQUIRED PUBLIC DISCLOSURE FOR ACO PARTICIPATION WAIVER
COASTAL PLAINS NETWORK, LLC**

The Secretary of U.S. Department of Health and Human Services has made available waivers of certain federal laws to Accountable Care Organizations (“ACOs”) participating in the Medicare Shared Savings Program (“MSSP”). To avail itself of these waivers, Coastal Plains Network, LLC (“Coastal Plains Network”) is obligated to publically disclose certain arrangements, which are described below.

1. Participation Agreement, dated September 1, 2015, by and between Coastal Plains Network and East Carolina University through its Brody School of Medicine. Pursuant to the Participation Agreement, Coastal Plains Network will provide the overall administrative support to operate the ACO, including:
 - a. Coastal Plains Network (directly or through its parent, University Health Systems of Eastern Carolina, Inc. (“Vidant Health”) or an affiliate of Vidant Health) will provide to Brody School of Medicine evidence-based medical practice or clinical guidelines, disease management programs, and other quality improvement programs for Medicare beneficiaries receiving care through Brody School of Medicine to facilitate improvements in care for individuals, better health for populations, and reduced expenditures for Medicare, consistent with the goals and contractual obligations of the MSSP.
 - b. Coastal Plains Network (directly or through its parent, University Health Systems of Eastern Carolina, Inc. d/b/a Vidant Health or an affiliate of Vidant Health) will provide to Brody School of Medicine access to certain information technology resources to facilitate improvements in care for individuals, better health for populations, and reduced expenditures for Medicare, consistent with the goals and contractual obligations of the MSSP. Information technology resources may include, without limitation, items and services necessary to provide utilization management, ACO data collection and integration, care management, and patient registries (in connection with the treatment of chronic diseases) related to Medicare beneficiaries receiving care through Brody School of Medicine.
